



AGREEMENT OF CONDUCT

WELCOME!

SWAT is Club Kid's **Senior Wings Adventure Team**. The objective for SWAT is to teach young adults ages 12 to 15 about leadership and teamwork in a positive, safe, and dynamic environment. Members of SWAT will be given daily planning time to decide what they wish to achieve from the group and how they will make it happen. The planning will include assisting and implementing projects and activities for our younger campers, goal setting as a group and helping to choose the community service projects and activities outside of Wings that they would like to be involved in. With guidance of their counselors, the SWAT team will have a big say in their daily activities.

Because of the activities that these kids will be involved in, anyone signing up for the group will be expected to behave in a manner that is appropriate to achieve our goals. The expectation is that the child is polite, respectful and willing and able to behave in a safe and appropriate manner as a role model for the other campers. SWAT kids will be expected to safely engage in outside activities and community events set a good example as representatives of Club Kid at Wing Center. If a child is not able to behave accordingly, the counselor may choose to expel the child immediately. Childcare at Wings Center ends at the age of 12 years old.

Being a member of the SWAT group is a privilege and not an entitlement.

Our goal is to teach young adults valuable lessons in leadership and responsibility while fostering the values that represent Wings Center as a whole. Our hope is that anyone involved in SWAT will gain a sense of pride and accomplishment while also enjoying the activities that the Wings Center building has to offer.

All SWAT members must read through the **CK handbook** and sign and return the **agreement of conduct** on or before the first day of camp.

Note To SWAT Parents

During your child's time in the SWAT group there will be more opportunities for us to leave the building outside of our typical field trip days. With this group we have the opportunity to get out for community service or fun or rewarding activities. We may not be able to plan ahead for some of these activities and there may be times that we will want to leave the building but it will not be on the weekly schedule. We will plan to leave and get back with the 9 and 4 o'clock range. If there is a chance that your child will be picked up earlier or dropped off later than this time frame, please have them communicate this to their counselors. Likewise, as a growing and maturing experience, children in the SWAT group will be expected to communicate camp information to their parents with little encouragement from the counselors. Of course, you are welcome to speak with our counselors regarding questions or concerns and we will make sure that the communication expectations are being met for all involved.

- I understand that I am expected to be polite and respectful and am willing and able to behave in a safe, responsible, and professional manner.
- I understand that I will be looked at as a mentor and role model for the other campers.
- I promise to safely engage in outside activities and community events.
- I promise to set a good example as a representative of the SWAT group, Club Kid, and the Wings Center.
